**Course Description:** Learning Environments discusses various theories of classroom management, various learning environments, and the creation of safe schools. This class analyzes how policy, theory, and diagnostics play out in "real world" settings and elaborates on trends to redesign school systems so that students are prepared for the information age by establishing rigor, relevance, and continuity in education from kindergarten to postsecondary education.

**Rational:** The Learning Environments class is intended to prepare future educators in the area of classroom management, learning styles, differentiated instruction and safe school environments.

Cultural Relevancy of Course Content: During the process of the course Learning Environments, participants and the instructor will explore the ways that classroom teaching can reflect both the core values and the processes of learning environments. Anishinabe, as well as other cultures will be explored. Students will be required to visit local classrooms. Students will experience and reflect on various classroom environment topics including management, learning styles, school safety and differentiated instruction.

#### **Instructional Objectives:**

#### By the end of the semester, students will be able to:

- 1. Identify factors that influence student motivation, learning, and pro social behavior.
- **2.** Explain the interconnectedness of curriculum, instruction, assessment and their effect on classroom management.
- 3. Produce and teach a mini lesson that supports student's multiple intelligences.
- **4.** Analyze your own philosophy of teaching practices and identify your classroom management plan.
- 5. Create a plan for a safe environment conductive to healthy learning for all students.
- **6.** Summarize ways to develop a positive home-school connection.
- 7. Implement strategies for promoting positive self- esteem, thus preventing discipline problems.
- **8.** Incorporate differentiated instruction in lesson planning.
