

Aaniin ezhiwebak? – Ah-noon eh-zhee-way-buck? – How is the weather?

Gimiwan – Kim-me-wun - It is raining

Gisinaa – Kee-sin-nah - It is cold

Noodin - New-tin - It is windy

Giizhide – Kee-zhee-day - It is hot

Binesiiwan – Pen-nay-see-wun – It is thundering

Awan – Ah-wun – It is foggy

Noongom – Noon-gom – Today/Now

Waabang – Wah-pung – Tomorrow

Dibikad – Dib-bee-cut – Night

Gii- - kee – Past tense marker

Gii-gimiwan – It rained

Gii-awan – It was foggy

Gii-gisinaa – It was cold

Bijjinaago – Bih-chee-nah-go – Yesterday

Giizheb – Kee-sheb– Morning

Dibikong – Dib-bee-kung – Last night

Wii- - wee – Future tense marker

Wii-giizhide – It's going to be hot.

Wii-binesiiwan – It's going to thunder.

Wii-noodin – It's going to be windy.

Noongom gimiwan – It is raining today.

Bijjinaago gii-binesiiwan – It was thundering yesterday.

Waabang wii-giizhide – It is going to be hot tomorrow.

Dibikad wii-gisinaa – It's going to be cold tonight.

Dibikong gii-gimiwan – It was raining last night.

na – Makes a question (note: “na” is always placed second in a sentence)

Giizhide na? – Is it hot outside?

Gimiwan na? – Is it raining?

Wii-awan na? – Is it going to be foggy?

Gii-gisinaa na? – Was it cold?

Noongom na wii-gimiwan? - Is it going to rain today?

Bijjinaago na gii-gimiwan? – Did it rain yesterday?

Waabang na wii-binesiiwan? – Is it going to be thundering tomorrow?

Wii-awan na waabang giizheb? – Is it going to be foggy tomorrow morning?
