H.E.A.R.T. Project

Turtle Mountain Community College is the recipient of a Health Professions Opportunity Grant (HPOG) from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

This grant provides individuals on Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) and other low-income students with the opportunity to obtain education and training for occupations in the healthcare field that pay well and are expected to experience labor shortages or be in high demand.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the H.E.A.R.T. Project, students must:

- Be accepted for enrollment at Turtle Mountain Community College.
- Pursue a health-related career program offered through TMCC.
- Exhibit a drive to succeed in a health-related field.
- Have a family income below poverty guidelines established by the federal government.
- Qualify for state or federal subsidy:
 - TANF
 - SNAP
 - Commodities
 - Fuel assistance
 - General assistance
 - Free and reduced meals through the national school lunch program
 - Lifeline phone assistance
