Requirements

To proceed with the application process for the Master of Education program, you must meet the following minimum requirements for admission and have the following documents on file:

- Undergraduate degree (e.g., B.A., or B.S.) from an accredited institution in education or a related field
 - Transcripts: Official transcripts from all undergraduate/graduate college coursework.
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in the last two years of your undergraduate degree.
 - All application materials must be submitted to Dr. Rhonda Gustafson at <u>rgustafson@tm.edu</u> by the deadline.

Step 1: Additional Documentation

- 1. **References:** Applicants should provide three references. A minimum of two of the recommendations must be from professionals who can speak to your work ethic, your abilities, and your potential for graduate study. *The M.Ed. Reference Forms are provided with the application*.
- 2. **Statement of Intent**: Compose a 2-3-page statement of intent by addressing the questions below. Your statement should be written by you alone and represent your original work.
 - a. Your background: What key experiences have contributed to your commitment to work in the field of education or with education-related issues?
 - b. What do you view as your most significant professional accomplishment(s) and your most significant professional challenge(s) to date? How did they inform your development?
 - c. How do you currently incorporate the 7 Teachings in your work?
 - d. What issues would you like to tackle in your career as a leader through this MEd?

Please note that the admissions committee will carefully consider both the content and the writing in its assessment of your candidacy for graduate study

3. Current Resume: Please submit an updated Resume.

Step 2: Review and Admissions Decision

Application **initial** review process. All applicants must meet the requirements for admission to both TMCC and the Master of Education Graduate Program.

1. Once final admission(s) decisions are made, applicants will be notified.

Step 3: TMCC Admission Application

1. All students **INITIALLY ACCEPTED** to the M.Ed. program <u>have to complete the TMCC general</u> admission application process completely, at http://www.tm.edu.
